Open fires or even using camping stoves outside of campgrounds is strictly prohibited. Also be careful when lighting out the cigarette. Croatian coast is high fire risk area especially in the summer.

In order to fish in Croatia, it is necessary to have a fishing licence or fishing permit that is obtainable from Croatian local offices or travel agents. You just pay the set fee and off you go. There is no age limit for fishing in Croatia.

The Croatian law requires all recreational skippers chartering Croatian flagged vessels to have a certificate of competence. Under Croatian law, the Ministry of Sea, Tourism, and Transport can only recognize licenses issued by the national authorities of other countries. Tourists in Croatia can be certified at harbour masters' offices in Pula, Rijeka, Senj, Zadar, Šibenik, Split, Ploče, and Dubrovnik as well as at the Ministry in Zagreb.

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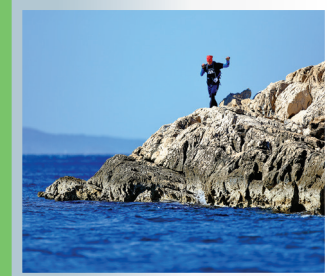

On the whole island, there are about dozen villages and hamlets including Tkon, Ugrinić, Kraj, Pašman, Barotul, Mrljane, Nevidane, Dobropoljana, Banj and Ždrelac.

Tkon is a typical fishing village and port, located on the

island of Pašman, sometimes referred to as the "Gateway to the Kornati islands. Tkon has the perfect location because it is so close to many national parks such as Kornati, Waterfalls Krka, Paklenica, Vransko lake and Plitvice lakes. The sea is very clean and ideal for windsurfing. Zadar and Biograd are the nearest cities, only 20–45 minutes. The basic activity of which the population here is engaged in fishing clam from the Pasman Canal – these are the seashells for which the place got its name – **Kun** (Tkon).

Ugrinić is a small fishing village next to Tkon. The Ugrinić surrounding consists of old, uninhabited stone houses, which ensures an intimate and relaxing atmosphere. Many of the locals will offer you homegrown vegetables and fresh fish.

The sunny islands of secluded bays and irresistible beaches

Some are shallow sand sandy, some gravel and some rocky with natural stone slabs for sunbathing.

On the northern side of the island, all of the beaches are sandy. FKK Sovinje (naturist beach with campsite) located at the end of the road outside the village Tkon a sandy beach which is a natural phenomenon and can be found in only a few localities of the Adriatic (the most famous is the island of Susak). It is a constant sedimentation of sand from the rocks and makes it so beautiful.

Beaches in Tkon popular tourist destination for visitors from Biograd, who daily come with the ferry for swimming and snorkelling. Whether you select a quiet and secluded cove or a sandy rhapsody, one thing is certain, you have chosen your place under the sun.

in the 17th century, with the legacy of the local Glagolitic A. Palaskov 1672) and the Benedictine convent of St. Kuzman and St. Damjan (located on the Cokovac hill, it is a cultural monument of the zero category, built by the Biograd bishop Teodorik in 1059 on the foundations of an early Byzantine fort and an old Christian church).

Čokovac is the last active male Benedictine monastery in Croatia and the world famous Glagolitic centre. It is available to visitors from June 1st to October 31st between 4 pm and 6 pm. After guided visiting, you can spend some time in monk's souvenir shop. There you can learn and buy homemade liqueur, aromatic herbs, natural creams... This is the most visited photo point on the island where panoramic view spread over the Pasman Canal and Tkon village.

The Glagolitic alphabet, also known as Glagolitsa, is the oldest known Slavic alphabet from the 9th century. The centre of Glagolitic writings is Benedictine Abbey Čokovac, above town Tkon on the island of Pašman.

Tkon contains numerous historical sites such as the parish church of St. Toma (mentioned in the 11th century, built in 1742, restored in 1938), Church of Our Lady of Seven Sorrows (built in the 18th century, located on the Kalvarija hill), St. Antun the Loner (built

The sailing regatta is not only a sporting event but also a celebration to honour ancient traditions and ancestors.

One of the most beautiful islands in Croatia, Pašman has a stunning coast, a breathtaking interior and a smattering of vibrant villages. Hike, bike or ride through the island's hills, swim, dive and snorkel along its coast or dance the night away in one of its lively nightspots. A great choice for family vacation.
